November and December 2021 Quick Questions

Our November Quick Question is a case study involving a 3-year-old female with no bleeding history whose pre-op PT and PTT results were PT 13.3 seconds [RI 12.6–14.6] and PTT 51 seconds [RI 25–35]. The study asks what is the most likely coagulation factor deficiency? A summary and comments are now available on Fritsma Factor at <u>November 2021 QQ: Case Study</u>, <u>Prolonged PTT Response</u>.

Our December 2021 question presents a hypothetical case, "*The resident orders a thrombosis risk profile on an inpatient being treated for a pulmonary embolism [PE].
